As a curator, you will report directly to the Director of the Collection of Historic Musical Instruments, be responsible for the scholarly care of the wind instrument collection, and support the team in all museum-related tasks. Key responsibilities are the documentation and digitization of the collection and the integration of the collection into international scholarly networks. Research projects are carried out in consultation with the Director of the Collection of Historic Musical Instruments.

- Scholarly care of the wind instrument collection
- Maintenance and updating of existing databases, expansion and updating of object documentation, and inventorying of new acquisitions
- Development of digitization strategies and visualization concepts
- Independent scientific research, publications, and communication of research results
- Securing third-party funding for research projects
- Development of innovative exhibition concepts and supervision of the permanent exhibition
- Planning and organization of musical events and educational formats for museum audiences

Job Requirements:

- Completed university degree in musicology or a related field (PhD preferred)
- Solid knowledge in organology, especially wind instruments
- Experience in museum work, including the conception and realisation of exhibitions and international cooperation projects, is desirable
- Competence in the digitization and documentation of cultural assets; experience in the field of digital humanities is an advantage
- Experience in acquiring third-party funding
- Strong skills in scholarly research and publication activities
- Fluency in German and English; additional language skills are advantageous
- A proactive personality who impresses us with their organizational skills and reliability
